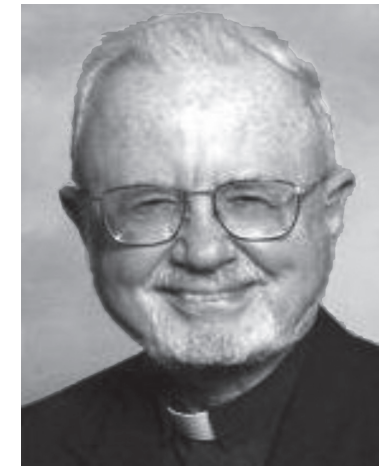

Rev. GEORGE T. MONTAGUE, S.M.

Rev. GEORGE T. MONTAGUE, S.M. (Marianist) was born on a ranch near Bandera, Texas, on July 8, 1929. In 1945 he entered the Marianists in Kirkwood, Missouri. In 1947 he professed his first vows as a Marianist in Galesville, Wisconsin. He completed his undergraduate work at the University of Dayton, Ohio, in 1950. In 1954 he was assigned to the Marianist International Seminary in Fribourg, Switzerland, where he pursued theological studies at the University of Fribourg. Ordained a priest in 1958, he received his Licentiate in Sacred Theology in 1959 and his doctorate in Sacred Theology (S.T.D.). From 1961 he taught theology, Old and New Testament at St. Mary's University (San Antonio), having been appointed in 1963 director of the graduate theology program. Appointed full professor with tenure, 1971. Elected member of the Faculty Senate 1965-1972, serving as president 1967-1968. In September 1972 he was appointed rector of the Marianist American Seminary in St. Louis. He is presently a Professor at St. Mary's University in San Antonio, TX.
